H. H. Swamiji, the Chairman could not be present for the meeting due to pre-occupation with other engagements. Justice Sri. Shivaraj V Patil, Co-Chairman, JSS Institutions, Bengaluru was requested to preside over the meeting.

Sri. Shivaraj V Patil presided over the meeting and conducted the proceedings.

The Principal, Member Secretary welcomed the Honorable Chairman and Members for the 37th Governing Council Meeting. He requested Justice Sri. Shivaraj V Patil, Co-Chairman, JSS Institutions, Bengaluru to chair the meeting. The Chairman greeted all the members present in the meeting and initiated the discussions.

37.01 To read and record the Proceedings of the 36th Governing Council Meeting held on 9th June 2020.

The proceedings of the previous Governing Council meeting were read and approved.

Resolution:

- ***The Governing Council resolved to record the minutes of 36th Governing Council meeting held on 9th June 2020 as read and approved.***

37.02 Action Taken Report on the points of Previous Governing Council Meeting

WELCOME REMARKS (IN 36th GC MEETING) : Achievements of JSSATE, Bengaluru viz., Further Accreditation of 5 UG Programs, QS-IGauge Ranking, New Projects, MODROB, Induction of New GC Members, **etc.**

Observations in the Previous Meeting

- Start working right now and put in all efforts to overcome all the deficiencies and ensure that the Institute should score more than 750 points out of 1000 and obtain 6 years of accreditation in the next term.
- Try for achieving “Diamond” category rating in the term of QS-IGauge rating process.

Action Taken :

- Industry – Institute activities like executing MOU's with Good Number of companies for training students & faculty on New Technology, Internships, Projects, Paid Internships, Placements and establishing research centers in



collaboration with Industries to improve scores. Till date, 35 New collaborations have been signed. Total 47.

- New Methodologies have been adopted in Teaching to achieve good results – Digital Platform.
- Further accreditation for Electronics & Instrumentation was due on 30th June 2021. The department is preparing the compliance report to be submitted to NBA New Delhi.
- Further recognition of QS-IGauge is due in 2022.

Discussions in Present Meeting

- Dr. C. G. Betsurmth, Executive Secretary, JSSMVP, Mysore wanted to know the new methodology used for better teaching learning process other than regular Teaching.

Dr. Mrityunjaya V Latte, Principal and Member Secretary, mentioned that since class room teaching is not happened for the last one and half year, the innovative teaching process was done on Google meet platform. Faculty have rendered innovative teaching through PPT's, Mini Projects, Problem Solving Techniques, etc.. Everything was on digital platform and there was no physical intervention in the classroom.

- Executive Secretary, also wanted to know whether the Institute has reached 100% attendance during online teaching.

Principal informed that the Institute could reach only 85% attendance. 10 to 15% of students always had complains on poor network and other constraints on having computer and internet facilities.

- Executive Secretary wanted to know the measures initiated for those 15% students who were absent all time.

Principal mentioned that teachers have attended to the problems of these students individually. All teachers would conduct mentor meetings very frequently. These students were asked to come online and provided with Learning materials, Subject Notes and conducted Doubt Clearing Sessions every week regularly.

- The Chairman sought explanation from Principal about the Further Accreditation of E&IE program which was due on 30/06/2021. Wanted to know the reason behind the delay in submission of SAR.



- Principal informed that further accreditation of E&IE program was due on 30/06/2021. Due to Covid-19 pandemic the Institute was locked and the SAR was not submitted within due date. As per the direction of Joint Director the NBA office was contacted and sought permission to submit the SAR in the Second week of September 2021. The SAR is reviewed and now completely ready for submission. It will be submitted very soon.
- Dr. H. R. Mahadevaswamy, Joint Director, TED, JSSMVP, Mysore, mentioned that the resolution in previous meeting is “How do we score more than 750 points out of 1000, in the third cycle of NBA”. Strategies and measures taken to reach 750+ points should have been mentioned here. The strategies, analysis and the steps taken to address the gaps and at which criteria the Institute is lagging should have to be mentioned.
- Principal informed that the point raised by Joint Director is very relevant to the Situation. NBA has 3 following major observations with regard to our Institute.
 1. Facilities, Ambience and the Academic requirement have been taken care in a very systematic way.
 2. The only requirement is the improvement in OBE practice, Results and Placements have to be taken care regularly.
 3. The Research Publications, Projects and Consultancy have to be improved on priority.
- Joint Director, informed the Principal to identify the gaps as per NBA report and address the gaps. Prepare a report and circulate to all the members in the next meeting. The report should cover all categories. The marks scored in each criteria, measures taken to improve the marks in the next NBA has to be prepared. Identify where is the gap, steps taken to improve the gaps and identify where focus is required. A report containing all these should be submitted to the members in next meeting.

Resolution:

- To prepare a report on the measures implemented to score more than 750 points out of 1000 in the next cycle of NBA. To make the Analysis, - identify the gaps as per NBA report. The report should include the Marks scored in each criteria, measures taken to improve the marks, with Step by Step actions to improve the



gaps and area which need more focus. Prepare a detailed analysis with action plan and submit in next meeting.

ITEM No. 33.01 : on NBA Observations

Observation in the Previous Meeting

- To induct bright students as Members to the core committees formed.
- Teaching learning process have to be improved by innovative methods like problem solving, real world problems, solving current live industry problems, more teacher: student interactions, etc.

Action Taken :

- Merit students have been included in the Department Advisory Boards.
- Due to Covid-19 pandemic majority of the student engagement was on digital platform. The Institute will adopt new methods of teaching in the Academic Year 2021-22

Discussions in Present Meeting

- The Chairman wanted to know the experience of the Institution after inducting meritorious students to the Advisory Boards of all the Departments. He said that, we had a specific purpose of inducting the merit students to the Advisory Boards. Whether their suggestions are helpful to the Department.
- Principal informed that merit students inducted in the advisory boards of the departments requested that, the Teachers should engage more on teaching content beyond syllabus to a larger extent and help them in Mini projects. Their suggestions was definitely helpful to the Department as well as the Institute..
- Chairman also desired to know about the new methodologies adopted in teaching and the improvements seen after that.
- Principal mentioned that the Institute had deputed Dr. Mahesh B, Chemistry Department for a very specific training on “teaching with research concept” to Calcutta. He has undergone the training and initiated the same particularly, for first year students on how teaching can be adopted with research methodologies.
- Joint Director clarified that, the Chairman is asking about the new methodologies implemented and the improvements seen after that. Provide the statistical data of new methodologies adopted and the improvements seen after that. Instead of one case, analyse few cases and provide the information.



- Principal assured that, definitely he will analyze and provide the data in next meeting.
- Chairman mentioned that, his observations are purely general, not only for this item, for all the items. To assess the work done of an item the statement should be very broad and generous.
He said that, I would like to be very specific, measures initiated, efforts are on, are only statements, this cannot be accepted. It can be through a broad statement with detailed analysis & step by step actions. Whenever a Governing Council resolution is passed, the report must be self content, self speech, concrete steps taken and improvements made have to be reflected. W need information with step by step action.
- Principal mentioned that except on this item, he has prepared statistical information on all the items. Statistics on Research Publications, Projects, Consultancy works and placements have been prepared. He assured that the Statistical Information on this item, will be submitted in the next meeting. .
- Chairman mentioned that from next meeting onwards, the action taken report should have the analysis, specific steps/measures initiated or a concrete step taken should be reflected. The idea is to see the work done effectively. Under each statement, concrete steps taken should be mentioned.
- Executive Secretary mentioned that last year, he along with Dr. Suresh, Director, Technical Division, JSSMVP, Mysore visited the Institute and asked to take specific steps on improving Research activities, Projects and Consultancy works. He asked, whether this is implemented and wanted to know the progress from there on.
- Principal mentioned that he has prepared the statistics and definitely the research publications are on the improving side. This time Faculty were able to publish 155 research articles in Scopus & WOS indexed peer reviewed journals. This is a good sign of improvement, which will definitely help us to achieve good ranking in NIRF. Good number of applications have been made to various agencies seeking projects. In this period, proposal worth 900+ Lakhs have been submitted to various agencies. Departments have also initiated small consultancy works.



Resolution:

- To prepare a report on adopting new methodologies in teaching and improvements there on. Actions initiated and improvements should be mentioned in the report.
- Action taken Report of an item must contain the analysis, measures and concrete steps taken and Improvements are to be included.

Item No. 33.02.01 STAFF REGISTERED FOR HIGHER STUDIES

Observation in the Previous Meeting

- To identify a person to look after research, projects and consultancy work.
- Faculty should take up more consultancy works and develop good research culture.
- Principal to mentor the faculty members regularly on writing project and consultancy proposals.
- HoD's to monitor their faculty members in writing small proposals for consultancy and projects. List all the proposals which are ready for submissions and bring it to the notice of the Principal for further improvisation.
- As there are lot of opportunities for small consultancy works in Civil Engineering, the department faculty have to be instructed to submit the proposals.

Action Taken :

- Dr. D V Ashoka, Professor, ISE department has been identified as Dean-Research to look after the Research, Projects and Consultancy works in the Institute.
- Good number of Faculty have applied for projects and consultancy works during this Academic Year. Principal and HOD's are mentoring the faculty members regularly on writing project and consultancy proposals.
- In total projects worth Rs.900+ Lakhs have been submitted to various funding agencies viz, VGST, VTU, DST, AICTE, etc.
- Civil Engineering Department faculty have been instructed to submit proposals for small consultancy works. Till date, six small consultancy works worth Rs.50,000/- have been executed.

Resolution:

- Noted the activities

Item No. 36.03.03 ADMISSIONS**Observations in the Previous Meeting:**

- To redesign the syllabus of E&IE and IEM departments to suit as per the current needs of the Industry.
- To contact the university and try to change the curriculum of E&IE and IEM branches to suit the societal needs.
- To submit a report the Governing Council about this in the next GC Meeting.
- If, the efforts of restoring the demand for IEM and E&IE courses are not effective. Chairman suggested closing the programs as per the proposal and start new program which are in demand.

Action Taken :

- New UG programs on Artificial Intelligence and Machine learning with an intake of 60, and Robotics & Automation with an intake of 30 have been approved for the Academic Year 2021-22. PG program on Data Science with an intake of 12 is also approved. AICTE have accorded approval for starting these programs. Approval from VTU is awaited.
- Application has been made to AICTE and VTU for closure of UG program in IEM and PG program in Thermal Engg. AICTE have approved the Closure of these two Courses. VTU and State Government have also issued NOC for the same.
- VTU LIC Team visited the Institute on 19/07/2021. Report of the Committee is awaited.

Discussions in Present Meeting

- The Executive Secretary asked about the preparedness of the Institute for the New Programs starting from this academic year. Whether any publicity, like advertisement in Newspaper and TV channels have been initiated for admissions. This will surely attract good number of students. Ensure that the college should receive 100% admissions this year.

Principal mentioned that with the initiative of the Joint Director in the first week of May 2021 itself, the Institute started working on admissions as well as the three



New Programs. We have already identified 4 industries to support for the new course Artificial Intelligence & Machine Learning (AI&ML). The students will be working on the Artificial Intelligence right from the first year itself with M/s. Qualitas. The firm is recognised as the expert in AI&ML.

The Institute has established collaboration with M/s. Wipro Technologies for Robotics and Automation. MoU has been already signed. M/s. Wipro is helping us with Robotics and Automation as well as on Drone technologies.

Regarding publicity, the Institution has made a strategic approach and has formed a group containing 22 faculty members and made sub group of 2-3 faculty to look into each and every issue. A deep analysis has been made and understood that from which PU Colleges, Sectors, Districts and States the students are joining to our Institute from past 5 years. We have reached these areas through Pamphlets, Banners and Advertisements. An App is Developed and is being monitored online 24/7. The live excel sheets are prepared as and when the enquiry is received and trying to contact each and every student, who enquire about admissions. The team is working in a very systematic way and we are hopeful that this time, the admissions will be good.

- *Executive Secretary enquired, whether details about these three new courses are included in the college website and the syllabus preparations are completed. Joint Director mentioned that the college website is completely updated with the three New Courses. Artificial Intelligence & Machine Learning, Robotics & Automation and Data Science. Departments have been created and the complete information about the programs is available. The brochures for Artificial Intelligence & Machine Learning and Robotics & Automation have been designed and also uploaded on to the website. The Institute has already received 4 admissions for Artificial Intelligence & Machine Learning. CET Examinations are scheduled on 28th, 29th and 30th of August 2021. After the examinations, we are expecting more seats for these New Programs.*

Principal Mentioned that, the admission team has circulated the pamphlets to various PU Colleges located in Institute surroundings and all over Bangalore. The team visited more than 25+ PU Colleges in Bangalore and Conducted Campaigns, Arranged to display the Banner of our Institute with the permission of those Institutes, distribute the pamphlets to all students and have discussions with the Principal, Staff and students of those colleges. Students data and the contact details of the aspiring students is collected. We have established a good



database. All our faculty members are working in a very systematic way. From the analysis of 4 years admissions data of the Institute. It is found that 75% of the students admitted are within 5km radius. With this analysis we arranged lot of programme to PU college students. Created a Whatsapp group. This group contains the whole information about the students and the admission activities were conducted. We have designed the brochure for AI&ML and Robotics and Automation in a very attractive way. He also displayed these brochures.

The chairman appreciated the good initiative taken by the college regarding the publicity for the new courses as well as the existing courses. He gave two suggestions.

1. Whenever the new courses are started in an Institute, attract as many students as possible. A big display can be made available near the entrance of the college, as well as within the campus in the prominent Places. We should not miss the attention of any visitor. If, New courses are registered in parents & students mind, they may start asking for brochure and other details about it.
2. It is worth advertising in the leading Newspaper. The amount we spent on advertisement will be covered by one extra student got admitted.

Principal mentioned that we have already placed a very big hoarding near entrance of the Institute and also in prominent places. it is proposed to release an advertisement in leading Kannada and English Newspaper on 1st September 2021

Chairman felt very happy, because what he is proposed to suggest is already done.

- ➔ Executive Secretary mentioned that, some of the leading Institutes like MSRIT, PESIT etc, have already advertised in New papers. The Institute should have released the advertisement by this time. All good candidates would have already preferred to join these Institutes.

Chairman would like to know the reasons for delay in advertising for admissions to the New Courses as well as the Existing Courses.

Principal mentioned, that it is proposed to advertise two times. That is after the completion of CET Examinations and during CET Counseling process.

Joint Director mentioned that, long back the institute was permitted to give advertisement. The logic behind the advertisement proposed after CET Exams is, CET will release the key answers after the Examinations. By seeing key answers, student will know where they stand, which college they would get



through CET. If advertisements are given that time, our college will be registered in parents/students mind and they would start visiting the college for management quota admissions.

Chairman said that giving advertisement at right the time is important. In future do it before, because every body should know about the new courses. If earlier it is advertised, student will start thinking over it. He suggested to give one advertisement in advance and another after CET Examinations

Resolution:

- To give advertisements for admissions twice. One in advance ,i.e. before CET and another after completion of CET Examinations.

36.06: Campus Infrastructure Development (Phase-III Constructions)

Observations in the Previous Meeting:

- To meet the Executive Secretary, JSSMVP, Mysore with all the necessary documents required for sanction of Bank Loan.

Action Taken :

- Principal has approached the Executive Secretary, JSSMVP, Mysore and it was suggested to speak to Sri. Rangaswamy, Former Zonal Manager of the then Corporation Bank. Because of Covid, it is delayed and we have decided to go with the construction of Amenities Block.

Discussions in Present Meeting

- Executive Secretary asked the Member Secretary, whether he met Sri. Ranga swamy and doing follow up on the loan application submitted.
- Principal informed that he is doing follow up with the bank officials. He mentioned that Sri. Rangaswamy is in Hubli branch. He has assured that definitely he will look into the loan application, during his visit to Bangalore.

Action Taken :

- Joint Director had conducted a three days Workshop on “Building a Research Eco System” for all faculties on 2nd, 3rd and 4th March 2021.
- Joint Director and Principal have conducted meetings with Deans and HODs and mentioned the importance and necessity of the Research and Publications.
- Now Recruitments have been initiated. We are looking for Senior Researchers to guide and monitor the progress.

Discussions in Present Meeting

- Executive Secretary mentioned that, an year back he along with Dr. Suresh, Director, Technical Education Division, visited JSSATE, Bangalore and informed all the faculty members to publish their research articles in peer reviewed journals. It was also informed that increment is sanctioned purely based on their performance. He also said that, If Faculty with PhD qualifications are not ready to guide the faculty members on research, It may be viewed seriously.
- Principal mentioned that the increment is sanctioned based on the faculty performance. This is being followed very strictly..
- He further added that, it was mentioned in the earlier meeting to look for a senior research personnel, Retired from ISRO , HAL , NAL, etc. who is very strong in research. Hence it s proposed identify the quality Research Personnel. Dean Research is also looking after research activities of the college.

Discussions:

- Principal mentioned that it is proposed to release the advertisement for the recruitments on September 1st 2021.
- Executive Secretary informed that, as some of the courses are closing and intake of 3 course are reduced, the existing faculty in the said departments can be adjusted to other Departments where vacancies are there. Re-work the total faculty requirement in the Departments, where the intake is reduced and courses are closed and re-submit the proposal.
- Principal mentioned that, he had submitted a detailed analysis of requirement of faculty to the Management, considering the closure of one UG (IEM) and PG (Thermal Engg) courses and reduction in intake of 2 UG and 1 PG courses.
- Joint Director mentioned that the principal had submitted proposal on the same. Totally 49 faculty members have to be recruited after considering the closures and reduction in intake.
- The Chairman while noting down details presented by the Member Secretary, wanted to know how the surplus faculty members available in the courses closed and intake reduced will be utilized.
- Principal mentioned that the excess faculty available in Mechanical and IEM will be considered for “Robotics and Automation” program. The faculty available at Civil Engineering Department will suffice for the existing intake. There are no surplus faculty.
- Dr. Hilarian Pushparaj wanted know whether the class room recordings of last year has been preserved. If preserved, this will save the time of faculty members as there is huge vacancies in the institute.
- Principal mentioned that last year online teaching records are preserved through G-Suite facility. The preserved records will be used for self improvement of teachers, better



understanding students and also used for those students who have missed their regular classes,

- Dr Hilarian Pushparaj suggested to use the recorded materials of New Courses AI&ML, Robotics & Automation and Data Sciences of other JSS institutes.
- Principal mentioned that, JSS has 3 Engineering Institutions. All our Engg colleges do not have these new courses. JSSATE , Noida is starting this new course viz. AI&ML and Robotics and Automation from this academic year only.
- Dr. Shyam Vasudeva Rao mentioned that there are lot of study materials available on these two New Courses in open source and in other Universities for nominal charges. It can be used in JSSATE Bangalore as well as in Noida.
- Principal mentioned that the institute has established a collaboration with M/s. Infosys. Infosys have developed a facility called Spring Board, where in all the study materials, facilities, etc. on artificial intelligence, and robotics & automation or any other latest technologies are available. Information in the form of video and audio is also available on Subject knowledge, Evaluation process, etc. All our faculty and students are given access to this as per MOU.
- Joint Director mentioned that, in addition to this, Institute is also tied up with Mooc, Coursera, Infosys Connect 2, etc. to share knowledge on the new courses.
