Proceedings of the IQAC Meeting held on 13th May 2023 from 11:00 am to 01:00pm,

Venue: Board Room, JSSATE, Bengaluru.

Agenda: Quality improvement & assurance initiatives of the Institute and Progress on Various Activities in the Institution

Discussions/Deliberations:

- Dr. Bhimasen Soragaon, Principal, welcomed all the members to the meeting and introduced the members. He set the context for the meeting and explained in brief the accreditation journey of the institute to get A+ grade by NAAC.
- Dr. Rekha P M, IQAC coordinator of the institute, presented the initiatives of the Institute. She mentioned that the Institute has taken up measures to assure the quality in all its processes and endeavors. In her presentation, she highlighted the previous meeting proceedings, first year academics, admissions statistics of the Institute, Academic Results, Progress in Research & development, Outreach activities conducted, placement statistics and Achievements of the institute for Academic year. She requested all the members for valuable inputs and suggestions to strengthen the quality improvement initiatives of the institute.

1. Quality improvement and assurance of the processes

Dr. Rekha P M, IQAC Coordinator gave a brief review of the preparation of Self-study report, Data validation and verification queries. The Visit of NAAC expert team and score of seven key metrics.

Recommendations:

- Mr. Thej Kumar appreciated the institution for securing A+ grade in NAAC and student ranks at university level. He suggested aligning the activities of IQAC with the vision of the institute.
- He added that in order to enhance outcome, it is necessary to first accept weak areas identified by the NAAC committee and self-assess. And plan accordingly to fill the gap by initiating a proper action plan with outcome.
- Dr. H R Mahadevaswamy, Joint Director (TED) – JSSMVP, also intimated to plan strategies to overcome weaker areas identified in the institution's NAAC report.
- Mr. Thej Kumar deliberated about the NIRF institutional ranking and to compare with benchmarking institutions and focus on what new can be done to enhance quality of education and hence uplifting the institutional ranking.

2. First Year Academics

Strategic plans made to improve the first year results were discussed. Insight on nomination of first year coordinator, to ensure timely and efficient performance in academics was shared. Frequent interaction with the first year students by Principal, Dean, first year coordinator and IQAC coordinator.



Recommendations:

- For results, Dr. H R Mahadevaswamy suggested to include count of backlogs in previous year and compare with current year and prepare action plan to improve further. For every Parent Teachers Meeting organized, data should be captured and impact analysis of the same to be prepared.

3. Admission

Admission statistics of all programs with intake was presented. In the academic year 2022-23, admission percentage was 83.33%

Recommendations:

- Overall admission is good. Members suggested to aim towards having admissions with good cut-off ranks.
- Mr. Thej Kiran asked the committee members to make JSSATEB more visible to society like SJCE, one of the top technical institutions under the umbrella of JSS Mahavidyapeetha. Strengthening social media pages of college will draw more societal attention. Social media team should promote institution featuring alumni, current batch students and their achievements. Small videos of campus and initiatives taken can also be included.

4. Semester end results:

The third and fourth-year results were presented. Based on the results the following recommendations were made.

Recommendations:

- Mr. Thej Kumar said that mentoring is a very crucial aspect with respect to slow learners and should be effective. Alumni to be assigned as external mentors to fill in the industry gap and to provide societal support which could be more effective.
- Analysis of first internals performance and the remedial action to be planned by identifying the slow learners.

5. Research Initiatives

Papers published in journals and conferences, patents granted, research projects approved for funding by government was presented.

Recommendations:

- Dr. Tarun suggested that an alumni newsletter can be planned to publish industry level articles, along with faculty and student's involvement.
- Gartner and Forrester research to be leveraged to understand the latest industry trends.
- Faculty and students to collaboratively research and publish papers with respect to current industry areas, which further will help in getting into MS degree in foreign universities for Higher studies. Also encourage them to apply



for patents.

- Mr. Thej Kumar asked to review all existing MoU and its effectiveness to be analyzed to make best utilization of the Industry/ Institute collaboration.
- Mr. Madwesh also voiced the need for sessions to create awareness on applying for patents related to innovation. Both faculty and students to be benefitted.
- Dr. H R Mahadevaswamy, deliberated that research needs to be strengthened by publishing in high impact journals and also to initiate joint collaboration with IIT, NIT, foreign university, and government sectors. Students' involvement in research activities and project funding to be empowered.
- Dr. Mahesh B, Dean - Research, guaranteed that the institute will take measures to uplift research interest among faculty, students and provide awareness about more research opportunities.

6. Outreach activities

List of all outreach activities organized for students was presented to the members. Namely, National voter's day, medical checkup camp, teaching activity adopted at village.

Recommendations:

- Mr. Thej Kumar, suggested to plan out around 10 activities, which includes thinking who, when, what and why?
- Gantt chart to be made for timeline measurement of each activity conducted. Activity to be planned with a structured approach like PDCA (Plan-Do-Check-Act) cycle.
- Dr. H R Mahadevaswamy, added that outreach activities should be planned and reflected in the calendar of events and outcomes should be measured.
- Mr. Thej Kumar informed that value-based training should be strengthened in collaboration with alumni network at regular intervals.
- Need to conduct motivational talks/ activities on stress management for all the faculty members. This enhances the mental well-being of the teaching fraternity.
- He also suggested planning top 5 initiatives/ activities and executing them in a time bound manner.
- Dr. D Mahesh Kumar, Dean - Student Welfare, assured that activities will be planned as per the suggestions made by members.

7. Placements

The placement statistics of 2022-23 (up to April 2023) was presented to the members.

Recommendations:

- Dr. H R Mahadevaswamy, suggested that the placement, higher studies metric output analysis can include number of job offers secured by each student, percentage of students placed in previous year and compare with current year, initiatives and action plan to be planned to improve further.
- Dr. Tarun, opined that having strong alumni network helps in placements for students. Conduction of online webinar every fortnight with alumni can be planned. Involvement of alumni for placements, projects would help students to upgrade learning skills.
- Mr. Madwesh gave insight on Cisco Networking academy, which will help students to upgrade their knowledge and as well as job profile and job opportunities. He also had the opinion that improving alumni interactions will open doors for student's knowledge enhancement and placement opportunities.
- Dr. N. C. Naveen, Dean - Academics, took all the suggestions given by committee members positively and affirmed to improve the industry connect and alumni interactions.

8. Milestone activities

Details of milestone activities of the academic year 2022-23 was presented. Few include, hosting an IEEE International conference, signing a MOU with IIT Guwahati, Centre for Development of Advanced Computing (C-DAC), setting up of E-yantra Robotics lab in association with IIT Bombay and open day project exhibition for final year students.

Recommendations:

- IEEE student chapter can be established and strengthened to improve research interest among students.
- Dr. Tarun Rao gave insight on student chapter provision. Institute should initiate the Microsoft and Google student chapters. He recommended to exploring on these student chapters and encouraging students to join them. Student ambassador to be nominated by the department. This enhances JSSATEB's visibility in the corporate sector.



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The meeting got over with a thank note by Dr. N. C. Naveen to all the attendees. Mr. Veeresh C S, Administrative Officer, JSSATE, thanked all the members for their constructive inputs and assured to implement the same.

PROCEEDINGS OF MEETING HELD ON 23/08/2023 to discuss about the activities to be carried out related to NAAC and preparation of AQAR 2022-23.

Venue: Board Room, JSSATE, Bengaluru.

Agenda: Status of the data collection process for the AQAR 2022-23.

IQAC coordinator Dr. Rekha P M informed about the AQAR preparation for data fetching is from June 2022 to May 2023.

Following guidelines were given to NAAC coordinators for the preparation

- It is suggested to update the library details with all new subscriptions and updating in the library automations.
- It also decided to fill the excel sheets and later after validating the data and start for the supporting document collection.
- QIM questions should be filled by considering with all the incremental growth of the Institutions.
- Criteria 5 QIMs can be updated as there are many activities organized by the student welfare including the scholarship distribution and outreach activities.
- Discussion was also made on the institutional policies whether to refine the policies and retain the same.
- To finalize the strategic plan for the Academic Year as it has to be updated in the college website and to be included in the Criteria 6.



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- Institutional Best Practices and Institutional Distinctiveness should be discussed and finalized by a brain storming Session along with the Department Heads.
- It is also conveyed that the CO-PO document should be maintained common across the entire department as shared template.
- Dr. Rekha P M insisted that the SSS (Student Satisfactory Survey) should be filled by instructing the students at the department level.

Review of the outcomes observed for the previous meeting agenda.

- For the current academic year dept. E&CE have planned conduction of National Conference. The tentative date will be in the month of November 2023.
- In the academic year 2021-22, the student project outcomes have been published in peer reviewed journals and faculty members have been advised to continue the work on student projects and publish in Scopus / WoS journals.
- It has been discussed and HoDs have been strictly instructed to advise the staff members to take Certification courses to improve the domain knowledge for effective demonstration of the courses.
- In-line with these four staff from the Dept. of ISE and one from CSE have registered and completed the NPTEL course.
- Weak areas in terms of research, consultancy and funding have been identified.

First Year Academics and for higher semesters :

Internal Audit of Department documents.

- Visit to Classrooms for Interaction with First Year Students: for Academic Monitoring process First Year Coordinator, IQAC Coordinator, Dean Academics and respective HOD visited to First Year classrooms and interacted with students about Teaching learning Process.
- Academic Monitoring committee has been framed to verify the academic related activities with respect to **First Year Academics** and for higher semesters.
- Dean Academics and IQAC insisted that the format sent should be implemented strictly. Team of members were constituted to review Question paper and scheme for all semesters.
- Department-wise audits have been conducted across all the departments.

To improve Semester end results

- Meeting was conducted with Slow Learners who are studying in the III & first year in the presence of Principal, Dean Academics along with the respective HOD. This was done for students who were identified by the departments based on the failures in previous semesters.
- Few students expressed that they have backlogs in first year subjects
- Suggested to use Sample methods may be 'brush-up' or 'crash' classes 2-3 weeks prior to SEEs, providing systematic course materials (notes) of all the modules, solving previous question papers as per the scheme & solutions of VTU, etc.
- Dean Academics presented the overall results obtained by respective departments, and also highlighted subjects, but not limited to, that need much more analysis, along with the concerned faculty and plan proper actions in future for obtaining better results. It was also mentioned that apart from these subjects, department must perform a thorough analysis of III Semesters results and provide details about not obtaining the expected results from respective faculty.
- The Top performers in all the departments are identified and Principal, AO and Dean Academics requested all the HOD's to take necessary actions and keep vigilant about the performance of these students personally for achieving good number of Ranks in the upcoming years.

Effective Implementation of the newly introduced courses to 3rd Semester, Inter / Intra Institutional Internship, Social Connect & Responsibility, Non-Credit Mandatory Courses.

- Dean Academics briefed about inter / intra institutional internship. As part of curriculum full-fledged internship of 4 weeks or a month to understand the industry work culture.. Informed that department coordinators are to be identified for Non-Credit Mandatory Courses - NSS, Physical Education, and Yoga.
- Dr. Rekha P M, IQAC coordinator suggested projects can be taken from industries for internship.

Initiation of final year course project work

- Dean Academics and IQAC coordinator highlighted that this initiation has been taken to provide quality time to students to develop product based real time projects.
- Principal suggested that the students be asked to frame problem statements for real time application-oriented projects.
- The principal insisted that the faculty members need to be in touch with the industries to get problem statements for the projects.

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- Dean Research also highlighted about students should carry out research projects and also to identify the student quality project and to patent the project.

Initiation of Research & Development Activities

- JSSATEB had signed a MOU with IIT Guwahati in the month of April, 2023. It was necessary to expand and explore the different collaboration activities. In continuation to it, a discussion was planned with all the faculty from Department of CSE, ISE, CSE(AI&ML), MCA- JSSATEB for further process and action.
- Dean Research scheduled Department wise meeting, interacted with individual faculty to know the research status and as well suggested to publish articles in quality journals and as well to apply for different funding agencies, scheme and government funds.
- To strengthen R & D , forum of voluntary researchers has been formed at JSSATE Bengaluru with the following objectives: i) knowledge sharing, ii) collaboration, iii) networking, and professional development, iv) research dissemination, v) writing projects, vi) filing of patents, and vii) staying informed about the latest developments in a specific field.
- Brain storming sessions was carried with prominent researchers to enhance the publications and also to strategies to aim for NIRF ranking.



Outreach activities

- Two-day workshop on **Capacity Building** is organized for the Heads of Department, Professors and Associate Professors of all the departments of our institute on 10th & 11th November 2023 in collaboration with alumni network at regular intervals.
