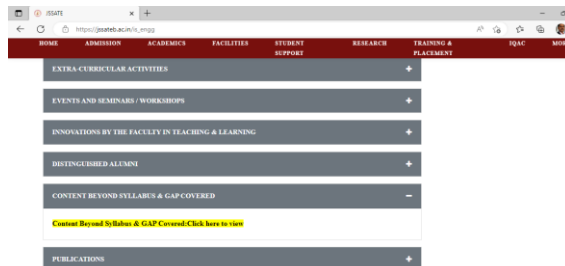

  - *Improvement is required with regard to TLP, Graduate Outcomes and Public Perception parameters. There is significant improvement in Research Promotion area compared to the previous years. This is a continuous process and the Institute is not far behind in securing a good position in NIRF.*

- **Root cause analysis of the results of all the courses where the pass % is less than 85% (Even semester, 2021-22)**
  - Additional class per week is introduced in time table
  - Focusing on solving latest three years question papers and to share the solutions with students
  - Question banks for each module are shared
  - Extra classes for slow learners are being arranged
  - Interaction with students by the course teachers regularly in their courses.
  - Mentoring by the mentors for holistic development – interaction with students and their parents.
  
- *The CIE question papers are being set moderately difficult in the courses as shown in samples, Annexure-3.*

**Discussions in Present Meeting**

- Dr. Hilarian Pushparaj desired to know whether the students are facing any learning difficulties, as the students have spent initial 2-3 semesters online. Principal mentioned that for few classes, we had conducted learning style assessments. Students learn by seeing, listening, writing and body language. This kind of analysis was made for 3 batches, where we found out that, students are eager to learn by seeing the pictures rather than just listening. Now, faculty have been asked to prepare pictorial presentations (PPTs) and also with puzzles, etc.

- Dr C G Betsurmath, Executive Secretary, JSSMVP, Mysuru wanted to know whether the Institute conducts supplementary exams to the students as that of SJCE, Mysuru.

Principal mentioned that, as the Institute is not autonomous, it cannot conduct the supplementary examinations.

**Discussions in Present Meeting**

- Principal informed that the admission for UG programs is slightly better this year. Out of the total 840 seats, 699 seats are filled and 141 seats left vacant. Total percentage of admissions

is 83%. The trend of showing lesser interest to the domain branches like Civil Engineering and Mechanical Engineering continued for this year also. Hence, the Institute is experiencing less admissions in these two disciplines.

- Chairman would like to know whether there is improvement in admissions compared to the last year.

Principal informed that, compared to last year there is slight improvement by 0.6%. Chairman informed that efforts are to be made to improve admissions.

- Dr. H R Mahadevaswamy, Joint Director, Technical Education, Division, JSSMVP, Mysuru mentioned that, as per the orders of Honorable Supreme Court, the Government (CET) should have completed the admissions by 30<sup>th</sup> November 2022. Since the Government did not had time, one more round of seat selection was cancelled. If this round would have been conducted, another 5-6% of seats would have been filled.

The Institute could not fill up the seats which were remain vacant in CET under Management quota due to the non-availability of time.

- Chairman would like to know whether the situation remains the same in other engineering colleges also. He suggested to compare the admission statistics of few surrounding colleges with our Institution.
- Joint Director mentioned that admissions to the Civil and Mechanical Engineering branches are better in few colleges like RV College of Engineering, BMS College of Engineering, PES University, etc. The situation of less admissions to Civil and Mechanical Engineering remains the same in most of the colleges. Principal and HoDs of Mechanical and Civil Engineering departments have to strengthen the teaching learning process, he suggested.
- Chairman mentioned that, there may be several factors like teaching, distance, facilities, employability, etc. However, admissions are slightly better than the last year and this short come is not only for this Institution. Efforts are to be made to improve further for the next academic year, by following the plans other colleges are following, he added.
- Dr. Hilarian Pushparaj desired to know, whether the total admissions include the drop out students. Principal mentioned that, it is only fresh and latest admissions for the AY 2022-23.
- Joint Director mentioned that from the Academic Year 2021-22, an admission team was constituted consisting of 24 members, including teaching and non-teaching members. This committee has reached about more than 10,000 students, publicizing the strengths of the Institute through Email, Whats-app, Phone, Twitter, face book, College website, Google, etc. Due to their efforts, we were able to attract good number of students.
- The Executive Secretary informed to create a database of students who are aspiring for UPSC. He suggested to nurture such students with our JSSTICE Centre and conduct a workshop by inviting an eminent officer.
- Chairman appreciated the good work and the efforts of the Admission monitoring team. He also suggested that out-standing / highlighted achievements of the Institute has to be widely

publicized through newspaper, media, social media, which will also help the Institute to attract the students quickly.

**Resolution:**

- To fetch the admission details from other Institutes. Compare them with our Institute and plan accordingly. plug any loop holes and efforts to be made to improve admissions in the Next Academic Year.

### **Discussions in the Present Meeting**

- Principal made a brief presentation of the semester end results of June/July 2022 examinations.
- Joint Director expressed his concern on the results of 2<sup>nd</sup> year Civil and Mechanical Branch students. The student strength in these two branches is less and it was expected of good results with these minimum students. He informed the Principal to give a strong message to the faculty of these branches.  
He further added that the faculty members should give individual attention to the students as the strength is less. It is suggested to go for a complete root cause analysis of results in these two departments.  
Though the input quality of the students to these branches is low, the faculty members have to strive to get good results and only then placements happen.
- Chairman expressed his unanimity with the Joint Director and suggested Principal to go for a root cause analysis of failures in Civil and Mechanical students. Principal, HoDs and faculty members have to discuss thoroughly to chalk out the best plan and put continuous efforts to get the best results. Only if this message is passed on to the stake holders, admissions will improve, he added. Steps taken must be documented and the actions be implemented to see a positive change in the results in the coming semesters.
- Executive Secretary also expressed his concern that the demand for these two branches are decreasing and admissions are low.
- Chairman mentioned that the demand for Civil and Mechanical branches do exist but the students look for the best college. In such a competitive scenario, this Institute should not lag behind and to be able to sustain. The present situation demands rigorous efforts to improve, else sustaining will be in stake. Hence, it is high time for all the faculty and other staff members to be more attentive, committed, and put their best efforts to sustain and grow in the days to come.
- Executive Secretary mentioned that the failures in 4<sup>th</sup> semester Mechanical Engineering (29 out of 39) reflects on the teaching of Mechanical Engineering department. Principal has to look into this personally as he is from the same Department.

- Joint Director mentioned that the seats in Civil and Mechanical departments of few colleges in Mysuru city are getting filled and the same is not happening in this Institution. A strategy has to be developed and a lot of preparations is required to teach first- and second-year students. If the students of 1<sup>st</sup> & 2<sup>nd</sup> year clear their results, they can easily pass in 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> year. Good teachers have to be identified and assigned to teach for 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> year students. This academic year, the Principal has already acted on this matter and, may be in a year, the results may improve.
- Executive Secretary mentioned that the teaching staff should improve their performance to see an improvement in results and admissions.  
Principal assured that he will have a thorough discussion with the HOD & faculty members of Civil & ME departments to come up with a strategy to improve results in first and second year.
- Dr. Hilarian Pushparaj mentioned that some kind of open challenge and incentive to be announced to students, who score good marks. This will boost the other students. Principal mentioned that this practice is already in place and the toppers in each semester are getting appreciation tokens.
- Dr. Shyam Vasudev Rao mentioned that lot of Industry/site visits can be conducted to students to enhance the practical knowledge in them. Practical exposure and lot of on-site training is to be offered to students at 2<sup>nd</sup> year level itself. In this regard, he is ready to help the Institution. Principal appreciated his cooperation and said that the industry visits are being organized regularly. However, he assured, the number will be increased. He expressed his concern on the attitude of these days' students - not working hard, no commitment, engrossed in their mobiles, etc. Due to this and the curriculum structure (more number of subject are being introduced) of the affiliating university with time constraints, many students are not able to cope with the studies and therefore more failures occur.

Principal assured that the suggestions offered by the Chairman and Members are well taken and the best efforts will be made to see the positive change with regard to the results.

**Resolution:**

- To do a root cause analysis of results of Mechanical and Civil Engineering students.
- To conduct lot of on-site training, hands-on workshops, industry visits, etc. to the students to boost their practical knowledge.
- To chalk out a proper strategy to improve results in 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> year, especially, in Mechanical and Civil Engineering departments. The issue has to be discussed on serious note with HODs



and faculty of these two departments and bring out a strategy. An improvement is to be evidenced in the results of this academic year.

#### **AGENDA ITEM No.40.06: CAMPUS INFRASTRUCTURE DEVELOPMENT (Phase – III)**

The present infrastructure at JSSATE, Bengaluru is just catering to the needs of the existing student strength. Additional infrastructural facilities are required owing to the expansion and increase in the number of programs planned in the years to come.

From this academic year, the institute has started a new PG program in MCA, intake in ISE and AI & ML is enhanced and another set of new UG programs are planned in the years to come. This requires additional infrastructural facilities in the institute. Moreover, the statutory bodies such as AICTE & VTU are mandating the exclusive classrooms and tutorial rooms, labs, sports facilities, staff rooms, etc. with required area, whenever a new program is to be started.

The **R & D activities** need to be strengthened in terms of collaboration with institutes of repute in India and in abroad, with industries for joint research work, new product and process development, patenting, establishing centres of excellence, etc. A separate block for this would add value for the R & D activities in the Institute.

To conduct large events in the campus such as orientation & induction for all the first-year students, college fests, alumni meet, etc. an auditorium of sufficient capacity is required.

Amenities blocks such as canteen, stationery shop, bank, etc. are essential parts of a campus. There is a need for establishing an exclusive complex for this.

In view of the above facts, we would like to propose the development of the following infrastructure facilities:

### PROPOSAL - 2:

- a. All the existing buildings have the plans (drawings) prepared by the Architects / Engineers. However, the plan of the Academic Block – A only is approved by the competent authority. It is requested to accord us permission for obtaining the approval from the competitive authority (BBMP) at the earliest. Suitable directions may please be issued to the Resident Engineer, JSSMVP in this regard.
- b. Fire and safety certificate for all the buildings is an essential document to obtain the approval and affiliation from AICTE and VTU every year. The process for getting the certificate for Academic Block – A is under progress. Permission may please be accorded to obtain the certificates for other buildings also at the earliest. Suitable directions may please be issued to the Resident Engineer, JSSMVP in this regard.

- c. Food and safety certificate is a mandatory document in all the hostels and canteens of the campus to obtain the approval from AICTE & VTU. Permission may please be accorded to contract the services to vendors who possess the Food Safety certificate. At present, the catering process (or the vendor) at the Girls' hostel and the canteen do not have this certificate.
- d. A severe dampness is being occurred in all the buildings due to rain and the leakages in waterlines. This is causing peeling off the paint and a layer of **concrete on the walls and roofs.**
- e. A public address system should be in place and the permission may please be accorded to implement the same at the earliest.

### MEASURES CONTEMPLATED IN THE PAST:

To a proposal by the institute in 2018 for the additional classrooms and amenities block, a permission was accorded from your good office to initiate actions on constructing the additional classrooms on Academic Block - A and B, Amenities Block and Ganesha Temple.

The Engineering Division, JSSMVP, Mysuru had prepared the estimate for the construction as follows and the necessary drawings were prepared by M/s. Swamy & Architects. However, the project has not taken off for technical / administrative reasons.

### Discussions in Present Meeting

- Executive Secretary wanted to know whether the statistics of publications given belongs to this academic year and how many faculty members have submitted articles this year. Principal mentioned that the publication statistics are given from last meeting to this meeting. He, however, presented the department-wise publications of faculty members from January 2022 to November 2022.
- Executive Secretary expressed his concern on the number of faculty publishing the paper. Hardly 50% of the faculty members are presenting / publishing the papers. He opined that a good number of quality publications and research funding will give good credits to the Institution in NBA, NAAC as well as in NIRF Ranking. He informed that serious actions will be initiated on faculty members who are not publishing papers and the faculty have to take it on serious note and on priority basis without affecting the teaching-learning process. Principal has to inform the other faculty members to publish the papers through conducting faculty meetings. It is also to be informed to prepare and submit a list of such faculty members to the management. Faculty members who are not interested to do publications may look for some other places, he warned.
- To a question by the Executive Secretary on the number of papers submitted, number of papers presented and the details of journals in the year 2022.

**Discussions in the present meeting**

- Principal made a brief presentation of the ongoing projects and consultancy works.
- Executive Secretary informed that the Expert sessions from the Scientists from organizations like DST will give vast exposure to the faculty members on how to write and submit project

proposals to various funding agencies. He informed to conduct good number of such expert sessions, at-least twice in a year.

- Principal mentioned that DST Scientists have assured that they will conduct one more such workshop on the same topic in June/July 2023.
- Joint Director mentioned that the contacts of Scientists, DST, New Delhi, who delivered expert sessions in the Institute in December 2022 was received from Dr. Suresh, Director, Technical Education Division, JSSMVP, Mysuru. He wanted to know that how many of faculty members attended the expert session.
- Principal mentioned that 35 faculty attended the session since many of them had classes and examination invigilation duty. Hence all of them could not attend the session.
- Joint Director expressed his concern on this and opined that this was a great opportunity and maximum faculty members should have attended by adjusting their assignments and classes, if any. This behavior of faculty members is not acceptable. He wanted to know the reason for others not attending the expert session and informed to take a written explanation from such faculty members. Principal informed that the explanations from the faculty have been obtained.
- Executive Secretary suggested to organize such important expert sessions have to be scheduled exclusively for our Institute with proper planning. All faculty members should compulsory attend the sessions and must be clear of the outcomes. For a question of his on the assessment of faculty performance, Joint Director and Principal mentioned that they are conducting the assessment.
- Dr. Shyam Vasudev Rao assured that he can bring the experts from his side to conduct the sessions on how to write a feasible project proposal. Joint Director and Executive Secretary requested Dr. Shyam Vasudev Rao to conduct such workshops in the Institution and the Principal said that the session will be organized soon.

## AGENDA ITEM No. 40.14: ANY OTHER MATTER WITH THE PERMISSION OF CHAIR

With the Permission of the chair the following additional points were discussed:

### Discussions:

- Dr. Shyam Vasudev Rao informed that there is a remarkable change and a good sign of improvement in the Institution. The Government is releasing lot of money for subsystem and components also, for which there is a requirement of Mechanical Engineers. He assured of his contributions to the Institution by motivating the ME students and by bringing other investment partners for selecting ME students for internships, projects and jobs. In this regard, he said, a detailed project proposal will be prepared and submitted. Industry partners who are genuinely interested make contribution for cause will be brought.

Executive Secretary requested Dr. Shyam Vasudev Rao to submit the proposal, since the institute is started collaborating with JSSAHER. The Principal has to constitute a team and send the detailed proposal. The status of this proposal must be made available in the next meeting.

- Dr. Hilarian Pushparaj informed that the admissions in Mechanical Engineering and Civil Engineering is alarming. A taskforce with HoDs and senior faculty members shall be set up to provide a proper learning platform with the help of SJCE Mysore.
- Executive Secretary suggested to organize a one-day workshop on Competitive Examination training with the help of JSSTICE centre. Government officials can be invited to guide the students. He also expressed his willingness to participate in this as a resource person.
- Few suicide cases are noticed in JSS Institutes. Students are also going to depression. As per the Instructions of His Holiness Swamiji, such students have to be identified by the HoDs/Mentors and counseled in the Institute. To arrange counseling for such students from Clinical psychological department, JSSAHER. The help of experts like Dr. Manoj Pandey may be taken for an Orientation programme as well as for counseling sessions. By next meeting one such session to be conducted, he informed.

- Principal informed that as the Institution is accredited by NAAC with A+ grade, now the trend of stake holders is to seek admission in autonomous or the Private/Deemed University colleges rather than the VTU affiliated colleges. In this regard, JSSATE, Bengaluru would like to go for autonomous with VTU or be a constituent Institute under JSS-STU or JSSAHER. Joint Director informed that the preliminary discussions have been made in this regard with JSSAHER officials and a call will be taken soon on this.
- Executive Secretary informed that the exact procedure has to be followed. It also needs progressive disaffiliation from the university. Taking approval with BOM is not an issue. It is to be decided as to where JSSATE, Bengaluru would be – under JSS STU or JSSAHER. He informed to submit a proper proposal.

Joint Director informed that the proposal is almost completed and will be submitted to the management to accord the approval. Once it is obtained, the application has to be filed online on UGC portal. The application for the progressive disaffiliation from AICTE and VTU will be made soon. It is better to go as an off-campus centre of JSSAHER rather than any other options.

Principal assured that the suggestions received from the Hon'ble Chairman and Members are well taken and a proper strategy will be chalked out for the improvement wherever it is necessary. He rendered his thanks and gratitude to the Honorable Chairman and all the members of the Governing Council. The meeting concluded at 1:30pm.
